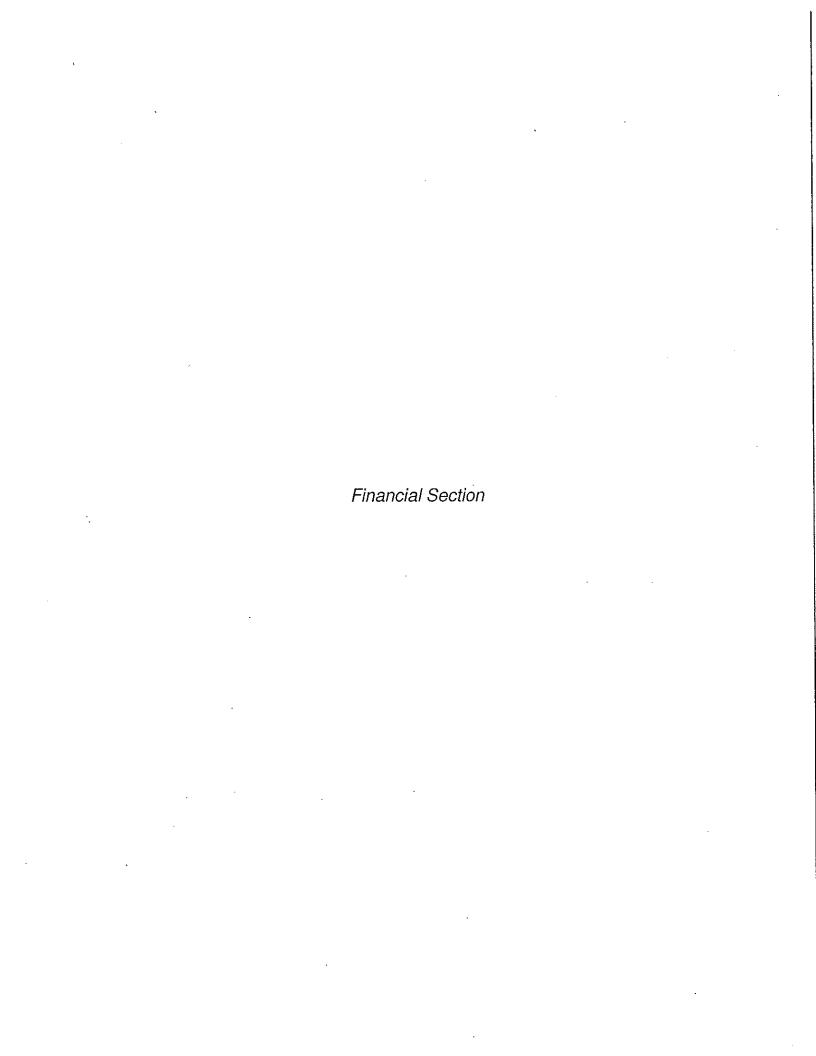

Report on the Financial Statements

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2020 AND 2019

A. Nature of Operations and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Nueces Water Supply Corporation is a member-owned non-profit corporation incorporated pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Revised Annotated, Article 1434A as supplemented by the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, Texas Revised Civil Stat. Annotated, Article 1396, for the purpose of furnishing a potable water utility service. Corporation operating policies, rates, tariffs, and regulations are formulated and effected by a Board of Directors elected by members of the Corporation. All profits arising from the operation of such business shall be paid out annually to persons who have, during the past year, transacted business with the Corporation, in direct proportion to the amount of business transacted. No such dividends shall be paid while any indebtedness of the Corporation remains unpaid, and provided also that the Directors of the Corporation may allocate to a reserve fund such amounts of the annual income as they deem necessary for maintenance, upkeep, operation and replacements, emergency repairs, and for deficiencies in income necessary to meet debt service costs. For financial statement purposes, the accounting records are maintained on the accrual basis of accounting.

Corporation's By-Laws

The Corporation has adopted by-laws which establishes the make-up of the Board of Directors, establishes the membership voting rights, provides for annual and regular meetings, provides for reserve accounts and establishes the rights of the members and other important regulations of the water system. These by-laws are included by reference herein, as amended from time to time, and are on file for inspection in the Corporation's office.

Authorization of the Corporation

The authorization granted under Chapter 13 of the Texas Water Code grants Nueces Water Supply Corporation the right to provide water utility service within a defined territory. Nueces Water Supply Corporation has Certificate Number 11948. The Territory defined in the Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) shall be the certificated service area.

Accounting Policies

(1) Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

(2) Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Corporation considers all highly liquid debt securities with a maturity date within ninety days of the date acquired to be cash equivalents. Management considers investments in public funds investment pools to be cash equivalents due to their high liquidity.

(3) Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivables are stated at the amount management expects to collect from outside balances. Balances that are still outstanding after management has used reasonable collection efforts are written off through a charge to bad debt and a credit to the applicable accounts receivable.

(4) Inventory

Inventory is valued at the lower of cost (first-in, first-out) or market. Inventory consists of expendable supplies held for consumption. The cost is recorded as an expenditure at the time individual inventory items are used.

(5) Utility Plant

The cost of additions to utility plant and their renewals and betterments are capitalized. The Corporation will capitalize costs greater than or equal to \$1,000. For financial statement purposes, the Corporation provides for depreciation by use of the straight-line method. The rates are intended to distribute the cost of depreciable properties over their estimated useful lives. Maintenance repairs and renewals which neither materially add to the value of the property nor appreciably prolong its life are charged to expenses as incurred. Gains and losses on disposition of property and equipment are included in the Statement of Activities. The cost of capitalized assets are stated at cost or fair market value if contributed. Estimated useful lives are as follows:

Distribution Lines 40 years
Meters and Other 3 years
Engineering 40 years
Furniture and Office Equipment 5 years

Impairment losses related to capital assets are recognized and measured when there has been a significant, unexpected decline in the service utility of capital assets. The events or changes in circumstances which lead to impairment determinations are not considered to be normal or ordinary. The service utility of a capital asset is the usable capacity which, at acquisition, was expected to be used or provide service. Common indicators of impairment include - evidence of physical damage where the level of damage is such that restoration efforts are needed to restore service utility; enactment of laws or approval of regulations as well as changes in environmental factors; technological developments, or other evidence of obsolescence; changes in the manner or duration of use of capital assets; or construction stoppage due to lack of funding. There were no impairment charges during fiscal year 2020 nor during fiscal year 2019.

(6) Memberships/Contributed Capital

Monies paid in as memberships are reflected as membership deposits, since they are refundable when service is terminated. Tap and contributed capital fees, which are collected when each member joins, are recorded at the same time as contributed capital, since they are not refundable once service is established.

(7) Estimates

Preparation of the financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the use of management's estimates.

B. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash accounts included in the financial statements are maintained at institutions which are covered by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. The depository bank deposits for safekeeping and trust with the Nueces Water Supply Corporation's agent bank pledged securities in an amount sufficient to protect its funds on a day-to-day basis. The pledge of securities is waived only to the extent of the depository bank's dollar amount of FDIC insurance. Nueces Water Supply Corporation's cash deposits at December 31, 2020 and 2019, were entirely covered by FDIC insurance or by collateral held by their agent bank. Investments not included in the above depository contract include \$1,108,576 in TexPool and \$306,346 in TexSTAR, which are made up of highly liquid pooled investments whose market value closely approximates cost.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2020 AND 2019

Public Funds Investment Pools

Public funds investment pools in Texas (Pools) are established under the authority of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 79 of the Texas Government Code, and are subject to the provisions of the Public Funds Investment Act (the "Act")Chapter 2256 of the Texas Government Code. In addition to other provisions of the Act designed to promote liquidity and safety of principal, the Act requires Pools to: 1) have an advisory board composed of participants in the Pool and other persons who do not have a business relationship with the Pool and are qualified to advise the Pool; 2) maintain a continuous rating of no lower than AAA or AAA-m or an equivalent rating by at least one nationally recognized rating service; and 3) maintain the market value of its underlying investment portfolio within one half of one percent of the value of its shares.

The Corporation's investments in Pools are reported at an amount determined by the fair market value per share of the Pool's underlying portfolio, unless the Pool is 2a7-like, in which case they are reported at share value. A 2a7-like Pool is one which is not registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) as an investment company, but nevertheless has a policy that it will, and does, operate in a manner consistent with the SEC's Rule 2a7 of the Investment Company Act of 1940.

TexPool

The Corporation has invested approximately 51% of its cash with TexPool. Pursuant to subchapter G of chapter 404 of the Interlocal Cooperation Act (the "Act"), the Comptroller of Public Accounts (the "Comptroller") administers the Texas Local Government Investment Pools (the "TexPool Portfolios") as public funds investment pools through the Texas Safekeeping Trust Company (the "Trust Company"). The Comptroller and the Trust Company have contracted with Federated Investors, Inc. ("Federated"), as administrator and investment manager for the TexPool Portfolios.

The purpose of TexPool is to offer a safe, efficient, and liquid investment alternative to local governments in the State of Texas. As required by the Act, the investment objectives of TexPool in order of priority are 1) preservation and safety of principal, 2) liquidity, and 3) yield. Principal is protected and market and credit risks minimized by investing in a diversified pool of assets of high credit quality. Actual risks are minimized by adequate collateralization and use of delivery versus payment procedures.

Texpool has the following authorized investments -

- 1. Obligations of the United States, its agencies, or instrumentalities with a maximum final stated maturity limited to 297 days for fixed rate securities and 24 months for variable rate notes.
- 2. Fully collateralized repurchase agreements or reverse repurchase agreements (i) with defined termination dates, (ii) secured by obligations of the United States, its agencies, or its instrumentalities, including certain mortgage backed securities, (iii) that require purchased securities to be pledged to the investing entity, in the entity's name, and deposited at the time of investment with the investing entity or a third party, and (iv) that are placed through primary government securities dealers, as defined by the Federal Reserve, or a financial institution doing business in the State of Texas.
- 3. No-load money market mutual fund that (i) is registered with and regulated by the Securities and Exchange Commission, (ii) provides a prospectus and other information required by the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 or the Investment Company Act of 1940, (iii) maintains a dollar-weighted average stated maturity of 90 days or fewer, and (v) includes in its investment objectives the maintenance of a stable net asset value of \$1.00 for each share.

- 4. TexPool may engage in a securities lending program that complies with the following:
 - a. the value of the securities loaned, including accrued interest, must be fully collateralized by (i) government securities, (ii) irrevocable letters of credit issued by a bank organized under U.S. or state law and continuously rated at least A or its equivalent by at least one NRSRO, or (iii) cash invested in government securities, commercial paper, mutual funds, or investment pools authorized by the Act;
 - b. the loan must be terminable at any time;
 - the loan terms must require that the collateral be pledged to the investing entity, held in its name, and deposited with the investing entity or a third party selected and approved by the investing entity;
 - d. the loan must be placed through primary dealers or financial institutions doing business in the State; and
 - e. the loan agreement must have a term of one year or less.

As required by section 2256.009 of the Act, TexPool cannot invest in the following:

- 1. Obligations whose payment represents the coupon payments on the outstanding principal balance of the underlying mortgage-backed security collateral and pays no principal;
- Obligations whose payment represents the principal stream of cash flow from the underlying mortgage-backed security collateral and bears no interest;
- 3. Collateralized mortgage obligations that have a stated final maturity date of greater than 10 years; and
- 4. Collateralized mortgage obligations that the interest rate of which is determined by an index that adjusts opposite to the changes in a market index.

In addition, TexPool will not invest in derivatives, commercial paper, or certificates of deposit. Diversification limitations govern investments and are applied at the date of purchase.

- Up to 100% of TexPool assets may be invested in government obligations of the United States, its agencies, or instrumentalities. However, no more than 60% of the portfolio may be invested in variable rate notes.
- * Up to 100% of TexPool assets may be invested in repurchase agreements. No more than 25% of TexPool assets may be invested in term repurchase agreements and no more than 5% of TexPool assets may be invested in term repurchase agreements with maturities exceeding 90 days.
- * Up to 15% of the TexPool assets may be invested in approved money market funds. No more than 10% of TexPool assets may be invested in a single mutual fund.

Credit Risk: Credit risk is the possibility that the issuer of a security will fail to make timely payments of interest or principal. In general, the lower the credit quality of a security, the higher the yield, all other factors being equal. To minimize credit risk, TexPool's investment policy allows the portfolio's investment manager, Federated, to only invest in obligations of the U.S. Government, its agencies, and instrumentalities; repurchase agreements; no-load AAAm money market mutual funds registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission; and securities lending programs.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2020 AND 2019

The credit risk associated with investments in direct obligations of the United States is low. Obligations issued or guaranteed by Federal agencies of government-sponsored enterprises are not direct obligations of the United States and offer more varied credit risk. Because the United States Government is not obligated to provide support to its instrumentalities, TexPool's investment manager will invest in obligations issued by an agency or instrumentality only after analysis that credit risk with respect to the issuer is minimal.

TexPool's investment manager will also invest in repurchase agreements and reverse repurchase agreements which are documented through the use of a Bond Market Association, formerly the Public Securities Association, approved Master Repurchase Agreement and collateralized by obligations of the United States, its agencies, instrumentalities or other obligations on which the principal and interest are unconditionally guaranteed or insured by the United States. Repurchase agreements and reverse repurchase agreement transactions will only be placed with primary government securities dealers or financial institutions doing business in the State of Texas, and proceeds received under reverse repurchase agreements will be reinvested in securities with the same maturity as the term of the reverse agreement.

Market Risk: Market risk is the potential for a decline in market value due to rising interest rates. For example, a bond or other security issued or backed by the United States Government is guaranteed only as to the timely payment of interest and principal; its market price is not guaranteed and will fluctuate in value as interest rates change. In general, the market value of a bond varies inversely with interest rates. If interest rates rise, then market values fall. If interest rates fall, then market values rise. Also, values typically fluctuate more for longer-term securities than for shorter-term securities.

TexPool's portfolio has low market risk due to restrictions on weighted average maturity and maximum maturity of any one investment. TexPool's investment manager will maintain the weighted average maturity of the portfolio at 60 days or less, no fixed rate security will exceed 297 days in maturity, and no variable rate note will exceed 24 months in maturity. Federated is required to maintain a stable \$1.00 net asset value and must take immediate action if the net asset value of the portfolio falls below \$0.995 or rises above \$1.005. These limitations are designed to minimize market risk.

TexSTAR

The Corporation invests in the Texas Short Term Asset Reserve Program (TexSTAR), which has been organized in conformity with the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, and the Public Funds Investment Act, Chapter 2256 of the Texas Government Code. TexSTAR is managed by a five-member board of directors (Board). In accordance with the Public Funds Investment Act, TexSTAR maintains an advisory board composed of participants in TexSTAR and other persons who do not have a business relationship with TexSTAR. Advisory board members are appointed and serve at the will of the Board of Directors. J.P. Morgan Investment Management, Inc. (JPMIM) and Hilltop Securities Inc. (HSI) serve as co-administrators for TexSTAR under an agreement with the Board. JPMIM provides investment management services, and HSI provides participant services and marketing. Custodial, fund accounting, and depository services are provided by JPMorgan Chase Bank, N.A. and/or its subsidiary J.P. Morgan Investor Services Co. Transfer agency services are provided by Boston Financial Data Services, Inc. The business affairs of TexSTAR are managed by the Board in accordance with its The bylaws set forth procedures governing the selection of, and action taken by, the Board. oversight of TexSTAR is maintained through various reporting requirements. TexSTAR is rated AAAm by Standard and Poor's and is operated in a manner consistent with the SEC's Rule 2A7 of the Investment Company Act of 1940. All investments are stated at amortized cost, which generally approximates the market value of the securities. The stated objective of TexSTAR is to maintain a stable \$1.00 per unit net asset value; however, the \$1.00 net asset value is not guaranteed or insured.

The Corporation acquires title to water lines in return for agreeing to their maintenance whenever a subdivision enters the Corporation. The cost of these lines are paid by the subdivision to the Corporation as a reimbursement of cost paid by the Corporation. The Corporation then records it as an addition to fixed assets and an increase in contributed capital.

D. Management

(1) Certificate of Convenience and Necessity

Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (No. 11948) was awarded to the Nueces Water Supply Corporation by the Texas Utility Commission of Texas as requested in Docket No. 6025 in 1987.

(2) Management Contract

On January 7, 1985, the Corporation entered into a management contract with the South Texas Water Authority for management and operations of its system. The contract provides for insurance and bonding, reporting, and management's procedures and responsibilities.

(3) Accounting and Billing

During the normal course of operations, the Nueces Water Supply Corporation remits funds to the South Texas Water Authority for the performance of various services including water purchases, inspections, administration, and repairs and maintenance costs.

For the twelve month periods ended December 31, 2020 and 2019, amounts paid to the South Texas Water Authority for these services totaled \$932,059 and \$867,448, respectively, in the following categories:

E. Income Taxes

The Corporation is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(12). Therefore, no provision has been made for income tax.

The Corporation adopted the provisions of FASB ASC 740-10-25, "Income Taxes - Overall - Recognition", which requires recognition and disclosure of uncertain tax positions in the financial statements and footnotes. Management has analyzed the Corporation's tax positions taken with respect to all applicable income tax issues for open tax years (2017 through 2020), and has concluded that it has appropriate support for any tax positions taken or expected to be taken and, as such, does not have any uncertain tax positions that are material to the financial statements.

F. Concentration of Risk

All customers of Nueces Water Supply Corporation are located in Nueces County, Texas. At December 31, 2020 and 2019, there were 1,035 and 1,001 customers on line, respectively. One customer, GEO Services, accounted for 41.05% of gallons sold in 2020, AND 32.46% of gallons sold in 2019.

The South Texas Water Authority is the sole source of water obtained by the Corporation for sale to its customers. The Corporation's water purchase contract with South Texas Water Authority was approved in June, 2015, effective on that date for twenty years.

G. Subsequent Events

Management has reviewed subsequent events and transactions that occurred after the balance sheet date through April 6, 2021, which is the date of the audit report. The financial statements include all Type I events or transactions, including estimates, required to be recognized in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Management and those charged with governance have determined that there are no non-recognized Type II subsequent events that require additional disclosure.

H. COVID-19 Pandemic

In November, 2019, the United States learned of the virus known as COVID-19. Over the past year, it has changed the dynamics of the economy, including the New York Stock Exchange, which remains volatile.

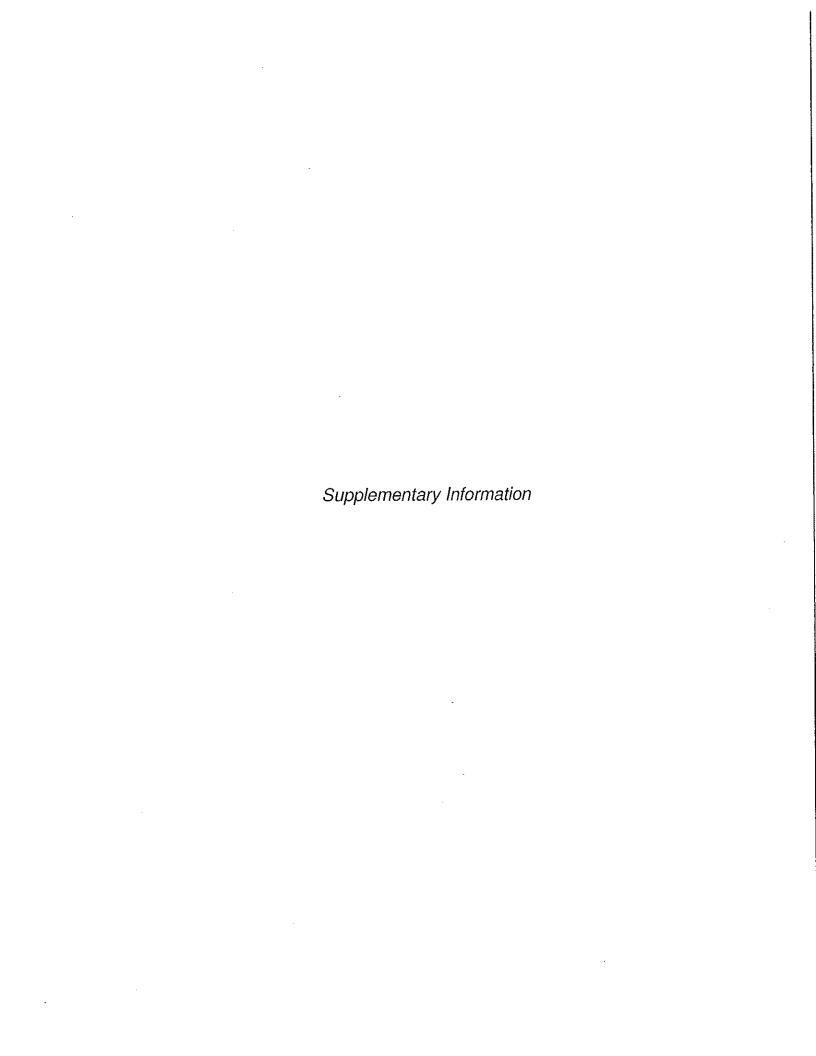
The Corporation and its Board of Directors have no control over these global and national events, except to guide the Corporation through these conditions as they present. These conditions may include, but may not be limited to:

- 1. Unstable economic environment
- 2. Potentially violent fluctuations in the stock market
- 3. Potential shortages of basic goods and services
- 4. Potential challenges in providing basic services to customers
- Managing any loss of revenue and unexpected expenditures that may occur

As of the audit date, these events have had no material effect on the financial statements.

I. Budgets

A budget is prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. The budget is approved by the Board of Directors, and used as a management tool and as a basis in determining the price of water charged to member users of the Corporation.



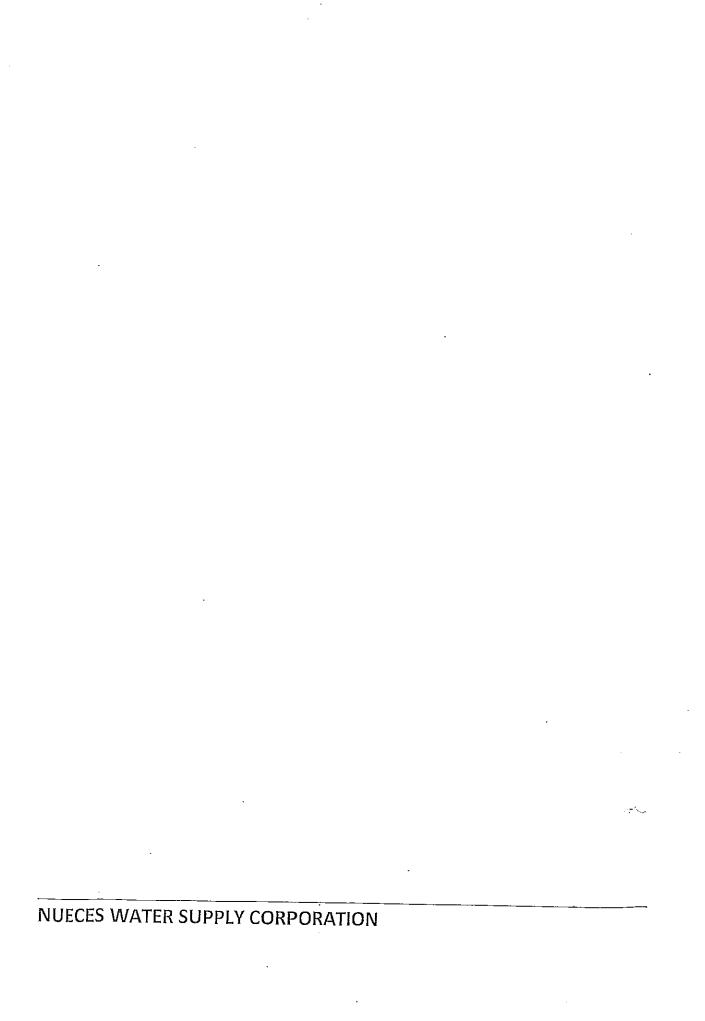

Ms. Serrato also gave a brief review of the January 2021 Treasurer's Report which had not been included in the agenda packet and said it would be presented fully at the next meeting. Ms. Zimmerman made a motion to approve the October, November and December 2020 Treasurer's Reports and payment of the bills as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Lundmark. All voted in favor.

- 5. NWSC Annual Membership Meeting.
 - Selection of Election Auditor
 - Approval of agenda and meeting packet for Annual Membership Meeting
 - Resolution 21-01. Resolution declaring unopposed candidates of Nueces Water Supply Corporation elected.

Ms. Serrato reported that only one Application for Board of Director was received by the March 1st deadline. She added that since there is one only position up for election, adoption of Resolution 21-01 will declare the candidate, Donald Lundmark, elected. She added that the Annual Membership Meeting is scheduled for April 13th but since no election will be held, an election auditor is not needed. The Board reviewed the meeting notice and agenda. Ms. Smith made a motion to adopt Resolution 21-01 and to approve the agenda and meeting packet for the Annual Membership Meeting. Ms. Zimmerman seconded and all voted in favor.

6. Nueces County project for construction of Banquete Pump Station to serve the Nueces Water Control and Improvement District #5 (Banquete) and Nueces Water Supply Corporation – Update on New Banquete Pump Station.

Ms. Serrato stated that J.S. Haren has been submitting pay requests on the new Banquete Pump Station project to Nueces County and the County has been invoicing STWA. The invoice that

will be presented at the next STWA meeting will fulfill STWA's commitment of \$425,000 and remaining invoices will be sent to NWSC. She presented an invoice in the amount of \$9,920.84 which will be applied towards the \$178,000 that NWSC has committed to the project. She reported that work continues and the project should be complete by March 18th. She expects the remaining invoices to follow quickly. Mr. Lundmark made a motion to approve payment of the \$9,920.84 invoice. Ms. Smith seconded. All voted in favor.

7. City of Bishop – Easement for Bishop East Pump Station.

Ms. Serrato stated that the easement between STWA and the City of Bishop has been approved by both parties. Once the City provides the signed document, STWA will make payment and have the easement recorded. She presented a draft easement between NWSC and the City of Bishop containing the same provisions as the STWA-Bishop easement with the exception that there is no offer for payment and the description of the facilities is different. Ms. Zimmerman made a motion to approve the draft easement and offer it to the City of Bishop for their consideration. Mr. Lundmark seconded. All voted in favor.

8. Cyndie Park Unit 1 Public Utility Commission Application.

Ms. Serrato presented a notice showing that dissolving of the Cyndie Park I CCN has been finalized. Attorney Bill Flickinger will begin to work on filing an amendment to the NWSC's CCN to include the CPI area as well as a portion of the service area of The Ranch Subdivision. LNV will be contacted for the maps that need to be included. Ms. Serrato stated that she will talk to Mr. Flickinger about the CCN including a larger area in order to accommodate future service requests. No action was taken by the Board.

9. February 2021 Winter Storm/Freeze Event.

Ms. Serrato provided a report on the February freeze event and added that she will also review the information with the RWSC and STWA Boards at their meetings this week. She stated that work on the damage continues and there is still work to be done but added that the biggest problem during the freeze appears to be that the needed flow was not being provided by the City of Corpus Christi. Staff attempted to improve pressure as best as possible. She mentioned that the Sablatura Park Pump Station appears to have received the worst damage and will probably cost the most to repair. A rented generator is currently being used because the control panel on the station's generator suffered damage.

Ms. Serrato also reviewed the hours worked by the field staff from February 11th to February 24th as they prepared for the storm and continued working during and after the storm to restore and maintain service. She reported that approximately 88 overtime hours were charged to STWA, 81 hours were charged to RWSC and 182 were charged to NWSC. She said that most customers were understanding and appreciative of the crews but that she expects that some customers will receive high bills and some requests for leak adjustments have been received. She stated that she will keep the Board informed on progress of the repairs.

10. Appointment of representative for STWA Executive Director replacement.

Ms. Serrato stated that in preparation for her retirement, the STWA Board has hired a consulting firm to assist with recruitment of an Executive Director. The full STWA Board and Ms. Serrato will be involved in the process. The STWA Board would like to have the Nueces Water Supply Corporation and Ricardo Water Supply Corporation select a representative each to serve in the process. Ms. Serrato requested that the NWSC Board select a person to represent NWSC. Mr. Lundmark volunteered to serve as NWSC's representative. The Board agreed on having Mr. Lundmark serve as the Corporation's representative in the selection process of a new executive director.

11. Adjournment.

With no further business to conduct, Ms. Smith made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 11:14 a.m. Ms. Zimmerman seconded and all voted in favor.

Appoint the newly elected Secretary-Treasurer (if the rules allow), another Board member and a person that is a member of the Corporation.

Board Action:

Determine which persons to appoint.

Summarization:

Appointment of a Credentials Committee should ensure that the Corporation is making an effort to comply with the election procedures.

Background:

During the last meeting the Board approved payment of the Corporation's first invoice from the County in the amount of \$9,920.84 as part of the NWSC's \$178,000 commitment to the project. Enclosed is the Corporation's second invoice in the amount of \$61,546.36. Payment of this second invoice will leave a remaining committed balance of \$106,532.80.

Analysis:

The separation of the existing and new pump stations in Banquete occurred approximately two (2) weeks ago. The separation occurred in phases beginning with the elevated storage tank (EST) being taken out of service and both the Banquete District (NCWCID#5) and NWSC customers receiving service from the existing pump station and the new hydro-pneumatic tank and compressor. About a week later, the new pump station was placed into service. The Texas Water Development Board is scheduled for the final walk-through on April 15th at 11:00 a.m. At this time, staff is checking on whether the updated SCADA graphics showing the new station and revisions to the existing station are nearing completion.

Staff Recommendation:

Approve payment of \$61,546.36 to Nueces County. Keep the Board updated on the acceptance of a completed new pump station.

Board Action:

Determine whether to approve payment of \$61,546.36 to Nueces County. Provide feedback to staff.

Summarization:

The next step after acceptance of a completed project (by Nueces County) will be a transfer of title or conveyance of the new facilities from the County to the Nueces Water Supply Corporation.

Re: City of Bishop – Easement for Bishop East Pump Station

Background:

Last month, the NWSC Board reviewed and approved an easement between the City and the NWSC which will cover the area of the land where the ground storage tank and hydro-pneumatic tanks are located at the Bishop East Pump Station. Yesterday, City Secretary Cynthia Contreras reported that Mayor Tem Miller had signed the easement between STWA and the City. Today, I received a scanned copy of the document. Enclosed is my email to Ms. Contreras requesting that the NWSC easement be placed on the City's April 28th Council agenda.

Analysis:

As reported last month, the attached easement has the same provisions as the STWA-Bishop easement with two (2) exceptions. First, there is not any offer of payment to the City. The STWA easement has addressed that issue. Second, the description of the facilities is different, as would be expected. I am hoping the negotiations between the City and STWA have facilitated this matter. I will attend the City Council meeting on April 28th. It warrants noting during the discussions between the City's and STWA's negotiation committees that this easement was mentioned regularly and the area encompassed in the easement was reviewed.

Staff Recommendation:

Continue efforts to acquire this easement on behalf of the NWSC. Keep the Board updated on the matter.

Board Action:

Provide feedback to staff and legal counsel.

Summarization:

The easement should provide security for NWSC's continued use of the property.

The City, for and in consideration of the terms of this Agreement does hereby grant to Grantee, and to such of Grantee's employees, officers, invitees, guests, and contractors as are authorized by Grantee to access the Easement Property, an easement and right-of-way to use the property at 333 North Birch Avenue, Bishop, Texas 78343 (the "Easement Property" as described in section II), only as follows:

For installation, construction, operation, maintenance, repair, replacement or removal of a 100,000-gallon ground storage tank, a 2,500-gallon hydropneumatic pressure tank, a 7,500-gallon hydropneumatic pressure tank, and all associated motors, controls, piping, valves, electrical wiring and equipment and other appurtenances (together, the "Easement Improvements"). Grantee represents that it is the owner of all Easement Improvements.

The City makes this grant solely to the extent of its right, title and interest in the Easement Property, without express or implied warranties of title.

Grantee, in consideration of the privileges herein granted, hereby makes the agreements, representations, and covenants, and agrees to the terms, stated in this Agreement.

II. EASEMENT PROPERTY

The Easement Property is located at 333 North Birch Avenue, Bishop, Texas 78343 is described in the plats as shown in Exhibit A hereto.

Grantee is not granted, and shall not have, any air rights above the Easement Property, or subterranean rights below the surface of the Easement Property, beyond that reasonably necessary for the uses specified herein. Grantee's access to the Easement Property shall be from the adjacent city street.

Grantee is familiar with all characteristics and conditions of the Easement Property and is not relying on any representations from the City with respect to the Easement Property or the suitability of the property for Grantee's purpose. The City does not make, and expressly disclaims, any representation or warranty express or implied that the property is safe or suitable for Grantee's intended purpose or safe or suitable for any other purpose. Grantee shall assume all risks in using the Easement Property.

III. CONSIDERATION

In consideration of the mutual promises herein, the City and Grantee have executed this Agreement.

IV. CITY'S RIGHT TO EASEMENT PROPERTY

- A. This Agreement is expressly subject and subordinate to the present and future right of the City, its successors, assigns, lessees, grantees, and licensees, to enter upon the Easement Property for any purpose including, but not limited to, the construction, installation, establishment, repair, maintenance, and/or operation and renewal of any public utilities.
- B. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to limit, in any way, the City's ownership interest in the Easement Property.
- C. In the event of an emergency, the City shall have the right to make connections to, and reasonable use of, the Easement Improvements for the purpose of accessing the water supply of Grantee. The City shall pay all of its own costs and shall reimburse Grantee for all reasonable costs incurred by Grantee as a result of the City's connections and use and for all water used at the same rate as that Grantee pays for water purchased from South Texas Water Authority under the then current Water Supply Contract between Grantee and South Texas Water Authority. All connections into Grantee's Improvements shall require preapproval by Grantee.

V. INSURANCE

Grantee, shall, at its sole expense, provide a commercial general liability insurance policy, written by a company acceptable to the City and licensed to do business in Texas, with a combined single limit of not less than One Million and No/100 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), which coverage may be provided in the form of a rider and/or endorsement to a previously existing insurance policy. Such insurance coverage shall specifically name the City as an additional insured. This insurance coverage shall cover all perils arising from the activities of Grantee, its officers, directors, employees, agents, guests, invitees, or contractors, relative to this Agreement. Grantee shall be solely responsible for the payment of any deductibles stated in the policy. Proof of each policy affecting such coverage shall be delivered to the City. So long as Grantee is using the Easement Property, Grantee shall not cause such insurance to be cancelled nor permit such insurance to lapse. All insurance policies and certificates shall provide that the coverage shall not be reduced, restricted, or otherwise limited until ninety (90) days after the City has received written notice thereof as evidenced by a return receipt of registered or certified mail. Grantor may from time to time request an increase in the required minimum limits of insurance coverage to amounts reasonably sufficient to reflect the liability risks and costs existing at that time. The Parties shall have sixty (60) days from the date of such request to negotiate an increase in the minimum limits of insurance coverage and if such negotiations fail, the matter shall be resolved through the procedures provided in article X. C. Mediation.

VI. INDEMNIFICATION

To the extent permitted by Texas law, Grantee shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City and its officers, agents, and employees against any and all claims, suits, demands, judgments, and expenses, including attorney's fees, including, but not limited to, liability for personal injury, death or damage to any person or property which is alleged to be caused by Grantee's actions and inactions in installing, constructing, operating, maintaining, repairing, replacing, and/or removing the Easement Improvements on the Easement Property, or any other manner while occupying or using the Easement Property. This indemnification provision, however, shall not apply to any claims, suits, damages, costs, losses or expenses (i) for which the City shall have been, or is entitled to be compensated by insurance provided under Article IV above, or (ii) which are proximately caused by the sole negligent or willful acts of the City, its agents, employees, or contractors; provided, however, that for the purposes of the foregoing, the City's act of entering into this Agreement shall not be deemed to be a "negligent or willful act."

To the extent permitted by Texas law, the City shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Grantee and its officers, agents, and employees against any and all claims, suits, demands, judgments, and expenses, including attorney's fees, including, but not limited to, liability for personal injury, death or damage to any person or property which is alleged to be caused by City's actions and inactions related to Grantee's installing, constructing, operating, maintaining, repairing, replacing, and/or removing the Easement Improvements on the Easement Property, or any other manner while Grantee is occupying or using the Easement Property. This indemnification provision, however, shall not apply to any claims, suits, damages, costs, losses or expenses (i) for which Grantee shall have been, or is entitled to be compensated by insurance provided under Article IV above, or (ii) which are proximately caused by the sole negligent or willful acts of Grantee, its agents, employees, or contractors; provided, however, that for the purposes of the foregoing, the Grantee's act of entering into this Agreement shall not be deemed to be a "negligent or willful act."

VII. CONDITIONS

- A. <u>Grantee's Responsibilities.</u> Grantee, at Grantee's sole cost and expense, shall be responsible for the installation, construction, operation, maintenance, repair, replacement, and removal of the Easement Improvements and for any costs arising therefrom, including but not limited to relocation of Easement Improvements.
- B. <u>Maintenance</u>. Grantee expressly agrees to maintain the Easement Property in a clean, safe, and good condition at Grantee's sole cost and expense for the duration of the Agreement. Grantee shall keep the Easement Property fenced and secured as may be reasonably necessary for the protection of the improvements and properties and for the protection of the public.
- C. <u>Modification</u>. Grantee agrees that the modification of any improvements on the Easement Property must be approved in writing by the City prior to any such modification.
- D. Water Service. Grantee shall not use the Easement Property or any of the Easement Improvements, directly or indirectly, to provide water service to any customer within the boundaries of the City's

- Water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) without specific prior written approval from the City Council, nor allow or facilitate any third party to do so.
- E. <u>Default.</u> In the event that Grantee fails to maintain the Easement Property or otherwise comply with the terms or conditions as set forth herein, then the City may give Grantee written notice thereof, by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested to the address set forth below. Licensee shall have ninety (90) days from the date of receipt of such notice to remedy the failure complained of and, if Grantee does not satisfactorily remedy the same within the ninety-day following receipt of the notice described in this paragraph the City may perform the work or contract for the completion of the work. In such event, Grantee agrees to pay within sixty (60) days of written demand for payment by the City, all costs and expenses incurred by the City in completing the work.

VIII. TERM

This Agreement shall become effective on the date set forth in the introductory paragraph of this Agreement, and shall continue thereafter until it is terminated in whole or in part accordance with Article IX below.

IX. TERMINATION

- A. Termination by Abandonment. If Grantee abandons the use of all or any part of the Easement Property for such purposes set forth in this Agreement, this Agreement as to such portion or portions abandoned, shall expire and terminate after thirty (30) days' written notice to the Grantee. The City shall thereafter have the right to enter the Easement Property and any rights of the Grantee shall be terminated as of the date of the abandonment. If Grantee fails to remove one or more items of any of the Easement Improvements or its equipment, the City may elect to remove all or part of such items at Grantee's expense, or may elect for all or part of such items to be deemed owned by the City as of the time abandoned, and all actual costs and expenses incurred by the City shall be the obligation of Grantee to pay to the City in full within sixty (60) days of receipt of the City's statement demanding payment. The City may deem the Easement Property or any part of the Easement Property to be abandoned if Grantee (i) has not made use of it for 365 days and (ii) has failed to maintain it in a useable condition for 365 days.
- B. Upon any termination, Grantee's obligation to remove its property shall include an obligation to remove all foundations and other subsurface objects, and Grantee shall restore the surface of the Easement Property to a level, sodded surface in good health compatible with the City's adjacent park property. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Grantee shall not be required to remove any underground water pipes, valves or other appurtenances that are used to provide water service to its customers; however, all terms and conditions stated in this Agreement shall survive and apply to any such underground use and to any such pipes, valves and appurtenances.

X. LEGAL ACTIONS

- A. Application of Law; Entire Agreement; Severability. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. This Agreement embodies the complete agreement of the parties hereto, superseding all prior oral and written agreements between the parties with respect to the subject matter in this Agreement. If the final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction invalidates any part of this Agreement, then the remaining parts shall be enforced, to the extent possible consistent with the intent of the parties as evidenced by this Agreement.
- B. Venue. Exclusive venue for all claims and lawsuits arising from or concerning this Agreement shall be in a State court sitting in Nueces County Texas.
- C. Mediation. If a dispute or claim arises between the parties relating to this Agreement or the performance of the parties hereto, the parties agree to use the following dispute resolution procedures, prior to filing suit:
 - (1) Either party may give written notice as required in Article III below to the other party that a dispute or claim exists and request that these procedures be commenced. A meeting then shall be held within 10 days' of receipt of the foregoing notice between the parties to attempt in good faith to negotiate a resolution of the dispute or claim.
 - (2) If, within 10 days after such meeting, the parties have not reached agreement on a resolution, either party may demand that the dispute or claim be submitted for non-binding mediation, and both parties shall participate in good faith in the mediation procedures to attempt to negotiate a resolution.
 - (3) Each party to the dispute shall bear an equal portion of any fees and expenses charged by the mediator.
 - (4) Each party shall bear its own attorney's fees and other costs and expenses incurred in connection with any meditation or other dispute resolution proceeding.
 - (5) All proceedings shall be held in Nueces County, unless agreed otherwise by both parties.

XI. COVENANT RUNNING WITH THE LAND: WAIVER OF DEFAULT

This Easement Agreement and all of the covenants herein shall run with the land; therefore, the conditions set forth herein shall inure to and bind each party's successors and assigns. Either party may waive any default of the other at any time, without affecting or impairing any right arising from any subsequent or other default.

XII. ASSIGNMENT

Grantee shall not assign, sublet or transfer its interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the City.

XIII. NOTICES

All notices, demands and requests for delivery of documents or information hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been properly delivered and received as of the time of delivery if personally delivered, as of the date and time deposited in the mail system if sent by United Stated certified mail, return receipt requested, and postage paid, or as of the time of delivery by Federal Express (or comparable express delivery system) if sent by such method with all costs prepaid. 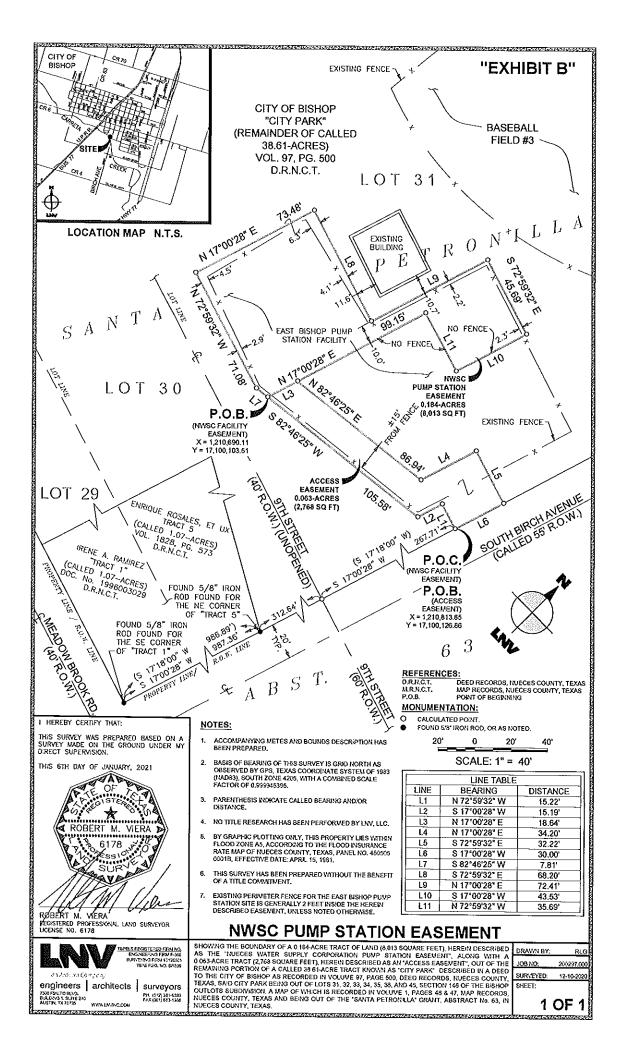

Background:

In the last memo on this matter, staff reported that the PUC had dissolved Cyndie Park I's (CP I) Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN). This allows the NWSC to amend its CCN to include CP I. In addition, since several property owners in the adjoining subdivision called The Ranch are also receiving service, the CCN amendment will include that area. Enclosed is the latest email correspondence on this matter.

Analysis:

Included in the email correspondence is a quote from Ardurra (previously LNV) in the amount of \$2,500 for the type of shape file maps required by the PUC. As the general manager, I have authorized Ardurra to provide those services. LNV provided the maps for the PUC Transfer Application when NWSC incorporated the CCN area previously in Cyndie Park II's name.

Staff Recommendation:

Provide updates to the NWSC Board on this matter.

Board Action:

Provide feedback to staff and legal counsel.

Summarization:

In my last memo on this matter, I stated that the process would likely take quite some time. As the Board is aware, I will be retiring soon – possibly still employed until the end of August. I would hope that the application has been submitted by that time with at least the initial review by PUC staff and a list of corrections and/or additional information needed. One final thought – the PUC has been under scrutiny as a result of the February freeze event and it is possible that this type of process will revert to the TCEQ.

Sorry for the delay in responding. The NWSC Board met on Tuesday and discussed the application. I reported that it would be best for me to discuss the situation pertaining to The Ranch Subdivision with Bill. He and I spoke this morning and determined to include a limited area of that subdivision.

Attached are two pdf screenshots using Google Earth.

The line on Ranch Road was installed as part of a Nueces County colonia grant project. The record drawings are attached.

The line on Branding Iron Road was installed as a result of the property owner requesting service and paying NWSC for the extension.

The CCN should include the area for Ranch Road line as well as the area on Branding Iron Road.

You asked, "how did the current customers request service?" With the exception of the extension request on Branding Iron Road, the customers received service as a result of the Nueces County grant project. What type of records do you require for the Ranch Road customers? Most (perhaps all) were receiving service from the CPII project prior to the 4" waterline extension connecting the CP area to NWSC's 6" line on FM 666.

For the Branding Iron Road customer, we can provide a copy of the customer's cost breakdown and any other correspondence related to activating service.

With regards to their service prior to the NC grant project, we would be assuming that they were on private wells. With regards to their service prior to the extension of the 4" line to CP, some (most) were receiving service from the CPII water well that has arsenic problems. We do not have any information on their private wells.

Finally, if I understand correctly, maps in the format required by the PUC will be needed for the two (2) aforementioned areas. NWSC utilized the services of LNV for the CPI and CPII maps. We will contact them about the same type of map for The Ranch. Noemi Flores, Accountant Assistant, will need to mark the active connections on the attached pdf files for LNV to include.

Pay Plan/Lockout Procedures

Memorandum

To: Nueces and Ricardo Water Supply Corporation Boards of Directors

Date: April 9, 2021

Re: COVID-19 - Pay Plan and Lockout Procedures

Background:

A year ago, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the enclosed memo was provided to the NWSC and RWSC Boards. Based on legal counsel advice, both Corporations adopted a COVID-19 lockout procedure allowing for (1) additional time for a customer to pay their bill and (2) a six-month payment plan to pay a past-due balance. Staff is now asking for direction on whether to revert to the previous lockout procedures/timeline or present Tariff changes to adopt procedures with additional time.

Analysis:

Several facts are pertinent to this matter:

- The Board may recall that a shorter time frame for lockouts was adopted more than a decade ago when issues with the previous billing system were discovered as a result of a customer's account becoming delinquent into a third month.
- Performing lockouts prior to entering a third month meant that the number of lockouts increased.
- The Corporations' revenues did not increase since the amounts charged to the customer are "passed through" to STWA for the additional billing, clerical and field time associated with the procedures.
- The current billing system, Logics, does not have the allocation problems that the previous billing system had when an account enters a third month in arrears.
- The COVID-19 procedures timeline are as follows:
 - o a customer is allowed two (2) months in arrears;
 - o when the third month's bill is generated, a letter is sent offering a payment plan;
 - o the "Payment Plan" letter provides about 1 ½ to 2 weeks to return a form agreeing to pay their past due balance in six (6) monthly installments Plus their current bill; and
 - o if the Payment Plan Form is not returned, a "Second Notice" letter is sent giving the customer two (2) weeks to pay their bill or be locked out.
- The results of these modified procedures are as follows:
 - The number of lockouts was significantly reduced. February 2020 was the last month when the regular procedures were used. In that month, there were twelve (12) NWSC lockouts and six (6) RWSC lockouts.
 - o STWA's service charge for these locks/unlocks have been paid by the Corporations.
 - This month, there were two (2) lockouts each for NWSC and RWSC.
 - o In the past year under the revised procedures, there has been a total of two (2) NWSC customers entering into a Payment Plan. For RWSC, there has been a total of three (3) Payment Plan Forms executed two by the same person on two separate accounts.
 - With regards to bad debt, there were no significant impacts. NWSC's bad debt was \$236.57 in FY 2020, \$985.47 in FY 2019 and \$2352.00 in FY 2018. For RWSC, it was \$388.12, \$417.62 and \$1,000.16 for FYs 2020, 2019 and 2018 respectively.
 - o Finally, the pre-COVID number of lockouts required at least an eight-hour day for one field tech and sometimes two (2) persons. The hours for unlocking the customers and office personnel's (including management) handling of customers could easily equate to thirty (30) man-hours per month per Corporation.

Staff Recommendation:

Although the CDC is warning about a possible fourth COVID-19 wave, Governor Greg Abbott has declared Texas 100% open for business. As such, the Board should be considering possible changes to operations. Staff recommends providing the Boards at a meeting in May with Tariff changes that (1) allow more time than under the regular procedures (2) but allow between 1 ½ to 2 weeks less than the current procedure by eliminating the step to offer a Pay Plan – which meant additional office time to produce two letters each month instead of only one per Corporation.

Board Action:

Determine whether to continue with the current COVID-19 lockout procedures or instruct staff to provide modified Tariff language for possible adoption in a May Board meeting.

Summarization:

In the attached memo from a year ago, it was noted that the Federal government expected utilities to comply with all regulations despite the difficulties created by the pandemic. I truly believe our staff has worked diligently to fulfill those responsibilities and will continue to do so as we transition towards "normal" pre-COVID operations.

Re: COVID-19 Response and Operation Changes

Background:

As the Board is aware, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. significant changes occurred in how business was conducted during March of 2020. On Monday, March 23rd, our office was closed to foot traffic. In addition, we ceased to accept cash payments. Signs were posted at the front gate and on the drive-through window explaining payments were accepted by mail or in the drop box in the form of personal checks, cashier's checks or money orders.

In addition, on March 30th the Receptionist/Clerk, Billing Clerk, Accountant Assistant and Part-Time Clerk began working remotely from home. Arrangements were made for remote access to computers and call forwarding of specific lines to their personal phones. Arrangements are being made for mail to be delivered to a secure, rural mail box which is large enough to handle both Corporations' mail as well as South Texas Water Authority's mail.

During this time frame, both the Nueces and Ricardo Water Supply Corporations would have conducted lock-outs for non-payment of bills containing usage for January and February. However, staff consulted with legal counsel who advised not to perform any disconnections. This was later followed by action by the PUC issuing an order prohibiting disconnection of utilities in the State. The temporary suspension of disconnections does not apply to late fees – per my discussion with legal counsel. However, in these uncertain times, this too could change.

In addition, legal counsel has advised if a customer recently locked-out requests restoration of service, the Corporations should comply. Staff has interpreted this to mean the lock-outs done on March 16 prior to the standard, monthly disconnection date and as a result of NSF. Each Corporation has one account in that category. As of today, there has not been such a request.

Analysis:

Again, as the Board is aware, the pandemic has taken an economic toll. At this time, it is difficult to predict when "business will return to normal." Regardless, staff anticipates and legal counsel advises that special considerations will be needed for customers that do not pay their bills during this time once the threat is over and, hopefully, businesses, work and therefore wages return. For many years, the Corporations have operated under a set of disconnection, meter removal and cancellation procedures which allow specific amounts of time after the customer's second monthly bill goes unpaid.

At this point, the best information available in terms of revenue trends is to examine the collection rate for the month prior to the outbreak to the most recent month. Enclosed are reports from the billing program for the period of February 10th through March 9th (99.76%) and March 10th through April 9th (98.04%).

Staff Recommendation:

Legal counsel has advised that a six-month period may be required after social distancing restrictions are lifted for customers to get their personal finances back on track. Staff does not disagree with this assessment. However, as mentioned above, deciding to waive disconnection procedures for a six-month period will be a significant difference from typical operations. Estimating the financial impact this would have on the Corporations will be difficult to ascertain. Nonetheless, staff recommends the Board consider this as a very definite possibility.

Board Action:

Provide feedback. Determine whether to develop a non-payment plan associated with COVID-19.

Summarization:

It should be noted that I have "attended" two (2) AWWA webinars on COVID-19 impacts to utilities. It is clear that the Federal government expects utilities to comply with all regulations. In fact, utilities are under a "heightened responsibility" to continue providing service. As one presenter stated, if a utility fails to comply with requirements it is not a good excuse to say COVID-19 has made it harder to conduct operations.

Winter Storm/Freeze Event

Memorandum

To: Nueces Water Supply Corporation Board of Directors

Re: February 2021 Freeze Event

Background:

As discussed during the Board's March meeting, enclosed is a table with a list of the main items affected during the freeze, the cost of overtime associated with the station, a list of the outside vendors/services used during and after the event, the materials expense and any South Texas Water Authority Work Orders pertaining to replacement/repairs. Staff estimates the total cost to the Corporation is \$29,483. At this time, the remaining items needing repair or replacement are:

- Leaking seals on a Central PS pump
- Cracked valve on a Meter Run Bypass Valve at the Driscoll PS
- Install drain valves (now blind flanged) on Bishop East PS, Agua Dulce PS and Central PS hydropneumatic tanks

Analysis:

According to the National Weather Service, the February freeze marks only the second time that a disaster of its magnitude has occurred – the first happened over 100 years ago in February of 1895. As you can see from the attached tables, all six (6) pump stations experienced problems of some kind. As reported during last month's meeting, Sablatura Park Pump Station had the most issues as a result of the control panel on the generator burning out, which we believe was as a result of power coming off and on repeatedly and the automatic transfer switch (ATS) attempting to activate the generator to power the station and then shut down the generator when power came back on. The rental of a generator, repair to the generator and replacement of three (3) valves at that station are \$19,300.

Frances DeLeon, Business/Risk Manager, has contacted AIA Insurance (AIA), the Corporation's property insurance provider. At this time, AIA has not indicated a need for any site visits. It should be noted that South Texas Water Authority's insurance provider, Texas Municipal League, may become involved due to how the property schedules are listed, particularly the generators. In the event insurance coverage excludes certain expenses, claims will be submitted to FEMA. Finance Manager Jo Ella Wagner has participated in the required online class and successfully applied for an entity ID in order to submit a claim.

Staff Recommendation:

Keep the Board updated on the status of costs, insurance reimbursements and any necessary FEMA claims.

Board Action:

Provide feedback to staff.

Summarization:

The event will certainly remain as a memory in my mind for some time to come. Thankfully, STWA has dedicated employees that worked diligently to address problems and restore service as quickly as possible.
